**Confidence:** Low for rainfall amounts and intensities on Sunday and Monday. Low for the possible transition to a strengthening southwest flow through Wednesday and Thursday

**Headline for Sunday 06 Jun 2021:** Mostly cloudy with some patchy rain, this becoming more showery with the odd heavier burst by evening.

### Forecast for Sunday 06 Jun 2021

**Weather:** Mostly cloudy, with some mist possible at first, through Sunday with some patchy light rain at times, this becoming more showery in the afternoon as some cloud breaks develop. The odd heavier shower can't be ruled out later in the day, and with showers or some rain continuing into the evening.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m:** 40%, improving 90% by afternoon, but decreasing 30% again later in the evening.

**Visibility:** Moderate or poor at times in rain and any mist to start, with areas of cloud down to 400m. Improving good or very good by early afternoon as cloud lifts above the summits, but moderate in any heavier showers later. Becoming moderate more generally again in the evening as cloud lowers to 400-500m.

**Meteorologist's View**

Low cloud and mist giving poor navigational conditions at height early in the day and again by late evening. Sunshine will be strong in the afternoon with protection recommended.

**Forecast for Monday 07 Jun 2021**

**Weather:** Showery rain mostly dying out through the early hours, but a cloudy and misty start to Monday. Further light rain or drizzle through the morning, but cloud slowly lifting, with some breaks in the afternoon, especially in the east of the Park. Scattered showers in the afternoon, possibly heavy and thundery.

**Maximum wind:** 10mph, variable in direction.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m:** 30%, becoming 90% or more by early afternoon.

**Visibility:** Moderate or poor to start with areas of cloud down to 300-400m. Becoming good or very good by early afternoon as cloud lifts off the summits, but with temporary deteriorations to moderate in showers.

**Temperature:** **Valleys:** Plus 10 degrees Celsius becoming Plus 17 degrees Celsius  
**At 600m:** Plus 9 degrees Celsius becoming Plus 13 degrees Celsius  
**Freezing level:** Well above the summits.
