Forecast for Sunday 05 Jun 2022

Weather: The main theme is for a fine, dry day with plentiful sunshine and turning warm for the afternoon, particularly for southern peaks such as Ben Alder. However a chilly start in sheltered glens, also some lower cloud possibly feeding around northern ranges early and late in the day.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: Near 100% by day

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good or excellent, but very poor within cloud, which infrequently develops around 500m, chiefly early and late in the day in the north.

Forecast for Monday 06 Jun 2022

Weather: Still predominantly fair weather, but sunshine and brighter spells more limited with cloudier skies perhaps bubbling up to bring the odd light shower, chiefly during the afternoon and evening. South again warmest but temperatures down a little from Sunday.

Maximum wind: East or Northeast 10mph or less

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80-90%

Low cloud and visibility: Generally very good or excellent, becoming moderate in light showers and very poor within cloud, which sporadically lowers to 500m.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 1 Celsius increasing 18 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Plus 7 Celsius increasing 12 Celsius during the afternoon
Freezing level: Above summits
