Forecast for Tuesday 02 Aug 2022

Weather: A windy day on the hills with outbreaks of rain and drizzle and extensive low cloud through the morning, becoming drier through the afternoon with a few showers, mainly in the west. The odd brighter spells possible later in the day but remaining cloudy by and large. Southwesterly gales at height, and remaining strong at lower elevations.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 20% in the morning becoming 50% in the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Low cloud down to 500 or 600 m in the morning, gradually lifting to around 700 or 800 m in the afternoon and evening, though some lower bases persisting in the west. Moderate or good visibility outside of cloud, becoming very poor within low cloud.

Forecast for Wednesday 03 Aug 2022

Weather: Cloudy with outbreaks of rain until mid-afternoon, gradually becoming brighter and fresher thereafter with sunny spells and a few well isolated showers. Fresh or strong westerly winds easing, and quite chilly on the tops.

Maximum wind: Westerly, mean 30 mph, gusting 40 mph, although stronger through the early hours.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30% in the morning becoming 90% by around mid-afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Low cloud down to 500 or 600 m through the morning becoming mainly above summits in the afternoon. Moderate becoming good visibility, occasionally very poor within low cloud.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 17 or 18 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 9 or 10 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above summits.
