


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Cold air persists across Scotland with some showers. The showers are mostly light and well scattered, with snow on high ground and sleet possible to lower levels. The main hazard is ice with clear periods between the showers having allowed untreated surfaces to freeze as well as where treatment has been washed off from any heavier bursts.

This is an update to the warning to reduce the southern extent, as temperatures have remained higher over much of the Central Belt.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **06:50 on Fri, 04th Mar 2016** until **09:00 on Fri, 04th Mar 2016**

Clear periods have allowed icy stretches to form on untreated surfaces overnight into Friday morning, especially parts of northern and eastern Scotland where wintry showers continue to come inland.

Please be aware of some difficult driving conditions.
