


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

The complex depression and contorted frontal system will remain slow-moving across parts of the UK during Saturday, bringing further periods of rain. 20 to 30 mm could fall quite widely, with 40mm or so possible in parts of northern Aberdeenshire.

With the ground being saturated in some areas, the amounts of rain mentioned above are likely to cause problems. As is usual in this type of situation there remains uncertainty as to which areas will be worst affected, so please watch for further updates to this warning.

The amber warning that had been in force for parts of southeast Scotland has been removed as the worst of the rain has now eased in that area, though there may still be local impacts here due to rain that has already fallen.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **12:10 on Sat, 07th Jul 2012** until **23:59 on Sat, 07th Jul 2012**

Outbreaks of heavy and persistent rain are likely during Saturday across eastern Scotland and some eastern parts of Northern Ireland. The heaviest and most persistent rain is expected to affect parts of Northern Aberdeenshire.

The public should be prepared for the likelihood of surface water flooding and some disruption to travel and outdoor activities.
