Forecast for Tuesday 09 Nov 2021

Weather: Occasionally heavy rain clearing through the early hours with long clear spells developing across the north. Cloud across the Perthshire hills and Ochils soon breaking to leave some good spells of sunshine through the morning. A little more cloud again from midday with a few mainly light showers through the afternoon and more especially evening, these turning increasingly to snow on the higher summits.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Near zero across the south at first, otherwise around 75%.

Visibility: Periods of persistent cloud above about 450-600m overnight and in the south at first, becoming occasional above 600-750m. Otherwise visibility, very good or excellent, but several kilometres in overnight rain and any snow showers

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Increasing chill effect through the day. Gusts close to 55mph over ridges and summits.

Forecast for Wednesday 10 Nov 2021

Weather: Clear or sunny spells and a few showers, these falling mainly as snow on the Munro's. Showers may develop into a longer period of rain or snow through the evening.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 20-30mph, with gusts around 50mph over ridges and summits through much of the day but perhaps 60mph in evening. A significant chill effect is expected.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Around 75%, chances falling during the evening.

Visibility: Very good or excellent falling to just a few kilometres in snow showers and in any more persistent rain and snow in evening.

Temperature: **Glens:** Around plus 4 or 5 Celsius at dawn rising to plus 10 or 11 Celsius by day

At 800m: Around plus 3 Celsius

Freezing level: Around 1200m, rising a little during the evening
