Forecast for Sunday 04 Dec 2022

Weather: Northern and eastern areas of the part turning rather cloudy with a scattering of light showers, snow level around 500m. More sheltered in the south west, with the likes of Pen Rhiw Ddu expected to stay dry with some brighter spells, these most widespread for the morning.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: Ranging from 40% in far north and east and 90% for Pen Rhiw Ddu.

Low cloud and visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in rain showers, very poor in snow showers and within cloud with bases occasional in north and east, infrequently so towards Pen Rhiw Ddu, from 500m.

Meteorologist's View

Some difficult conditions in east and north with occasional hill fog and snow showers coupled with severe wind chill at height.

Forecast for Monday 05 Dec 2022

Weather: Mainly cloudy with some showers, these always focused across the east and north, wintry above around 500m, tending to dwindle later in the day.

Maximum wind: East or northeast mean 20-25mph with gusts reaching 35mph across most exposed ridges and summits, easing gradually from the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: Initially 40% in east and 80% in west, improving later

Low cloud and visibility: Good becoming moderate or poor in rain showers, very poor in snow showers and within cloud with bases initially occasional in east, infrequent in west, down to 500m, improving later

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 1 Celsius increasing 10 Celsius during the afternoon
At 600m: Zero to Plus 2 Celsius
Freezing level: 600-700m
