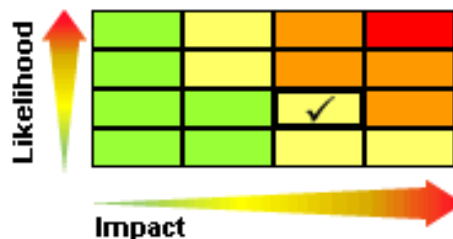
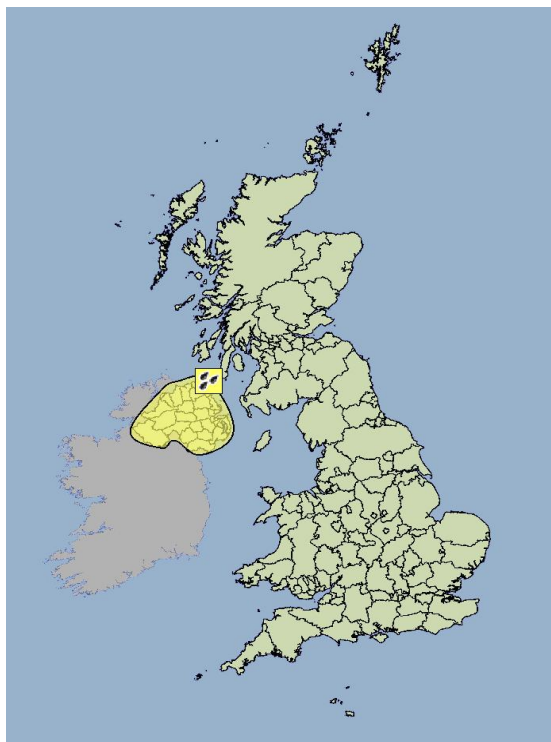




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Showers, some thundery, are affecting many parts of Northern Ireland, although the worst is beginning to clear from western counties.

Local torrential downpours are likely with 10 to 20 mm falling in an hour and as much as 40 mm in 3 to 4 hours. The thundery rain will clear from the west soon after midnight.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **23:10 on Tue, 22nd Aug 2017** until **02:00 on Wed, 23rd Aug 2017**

Heavy, thundery downpours may cause further flooding across parts of Northern Ireland for a time tonight. Flooding could cause further disruption due to road closures, and flooding of properties and businesses is also likely in places.

The warning has been extended into the early hours of Wednesday to cater for a slightly slower clearance, plus residual effects of earlier downpours.
