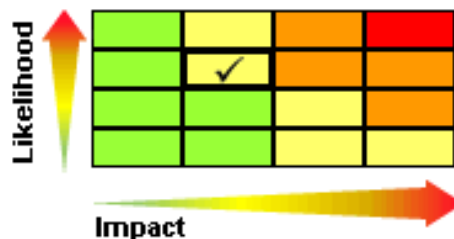
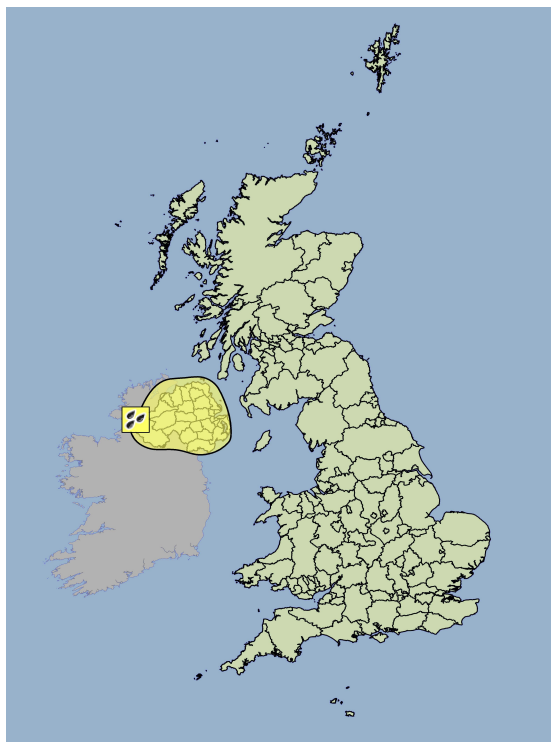




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An area of low pressure will move across northern parts of the UK today, with showers forming as temperatures rise. The showers will be slow-moving due to the light winds. The potential for heavy rainfall decreases again this evening as temperatures fall and winds pick up again.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **11:30 on Sat, 10th May 2014** until **19:00 on Sat, 10th May 2014**

Showers will turn heavy and thundery across Northern Ireland this afternoon. Although a few areas will avoid the showers completely, other locations could see rainfall accumulations 10 to 15 mm in an hour or less, and 20 to 30 mm in just a few hours. The public should be aware that some disruption due to surface water flooding is possible. The heavier showers will die away again this evening.
