Forecast for Saturday 07 Aug 2021

Weather: Clear periods overnight with still some heavy showers at first, becoming fewer and lighter. Bright or sunny spells on Saturday with scattered showers breaking out. Some heavier showers are likely in the afternoon with a risk of thunder. Showers then fading away during the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70%

Visibility: Mostly good with occasional cloud cover about 700 to 800m. There will be brief interruptions to poor visibility as heavier showers pass by with more extensive cloud cover about 600m.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Driest weather will be during the morning. Still lengthy dry spells between showers in the afternoon.

Forecast for Sunday 08 Aug 2021

Weather: Mostly dry, bright morning with some sunshine. Once again, showers will break out during the morning with a few heavy showers possible in the afternoon.

Maximum wind: East or northeast winds on the tops with average speeds about 15 to 20mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 60%

Visibility: Good for much of the time with cloud bases around 700 to 800m. Clouds more extensive lower down the hills as showers come along in the afternoon with brief reductions in visibility.

Temperature: **Glens:** 12 Celsius rising to 21 Celsius
At 800m: Plus 10 Celsius
Freezing level: Well above summits
