Forecast Issued on Friday 06 Aug 2021 at 03:35

**Confidence:** High for unsettled conditions dominating this weekend, with showers and some longer spells of rain, some heavy and thundery. Moderate for the trend towards less unsettled conditions by Tuesday.

**Headline for Friday 06 Aug 2021:** Showers, some heavy and thundery, becoming more frequent into the afternoon. Perhaps more prolonged rain developing after dusk, along with stronger winds.

### Forecast for Friday 06 Aug 2021

**Weather:** Showers developing through the morning and into the afternoon, some heavy and thundery, with a risk of lightning and hail. Some brief bright or sunny intervals likely. By dusk showers may merge into a more prolonged spell of rain.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m:** 20% at first improving to 70%, perhaps decreasing to 40% after dusk.

**Visibility:** Areas of cloud obscuring hills above 400m at first, but generally lifting above most summits by afternoon, with good visibility outside of showers. A few patches returning above 600m during heavy showers. Cloud likely returning to 500m with more prolonged rain during the evening

**Meteorologist's View**

A poor day, with most hills seeing showers or more persistent rain, with waterproof layers essential. Lightning also a risk at times.

**Forecast for Saturday 07 Aug 2021**

**Weather:** Blustery band of rain moving east during the early hours, with a chance of thunder. This followed by further heavy and blustery showers for much of Saturday but also occasional sunny spells. Showers have the potential to be thundery, with the odd torrential downpour.

**Maximum wind:** Southwest 15mph gusts 25-35mph.

**Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 600m:** 30% at first increasing to 80% by afternoon.

**Visibility:** Very poor early hours, with cloud obscuring many tops above 500m and heavy rain. Improving to give some good views between any showers, but quickly falling to poor at times during any heavy rain. Further spells of cloud on hills above 500m likely through the day, especially as showers move through

**Temperature:** **Valleys:** Plus 13 Celsius rising to 19 Celsius by afternoon.

**At 600m:** Plus 10 Celsius.

**Freezing level:** Above summits.
