### Forecast for Tuesday 03 May 2022

**Weather:** A lot of cloud expected throughout the day, this shrouding the Munro tops in the south and west of the area. Apart from a little light and patchy rain across the west at first, the morning will be dry. A few showers will break out in the afternoon but these won't last long. Rather cloudy in the evening with some longer spells of rain developing towards the south of the area.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 70% in the northeast, 30% in the south and west

**Low cloud and visibility:** Poor in extensive low cloud down to 400 to 750 metres across the west and south of the area, a few breaks may develop in the afternoon. Ranges east of the A9 will see the best of conditions with low cloud much more broken, bases down to 800 to 900 metres.

**Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View**

Rather cold under cloud cover on the higher tops

**Forecast for Wednesday 04 May 2022**

**Weather:** Overnight rain soon clearing to leave a mostly cloudy day with the odd shower, these may become more widespread for a time in the afternoon before dying out by evening. Rather cloudy skies for most of the day but some breaks developing in the cloud as the afternoon progresses and into the evening.

**Maximum wind:** Westerly 25 mph

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** 60%

**Low cloud and visibility:** Poor in cloud down to 600 to 900 metres, this most extensive across the west of the area. Breaks more likely east of the A9, especially through the afternoon. Otherwise very good visibility developing once cloud clears.

**Temperature:** **Glens:** Plus 6 rising to 16 Celsius  
**At 800m:** Plus 6 Celsius  
**Freezing level:** Above summits
