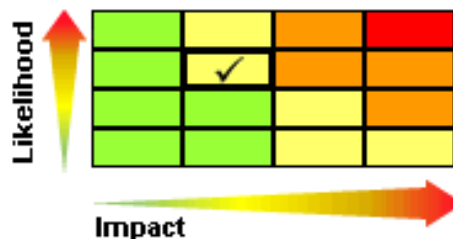
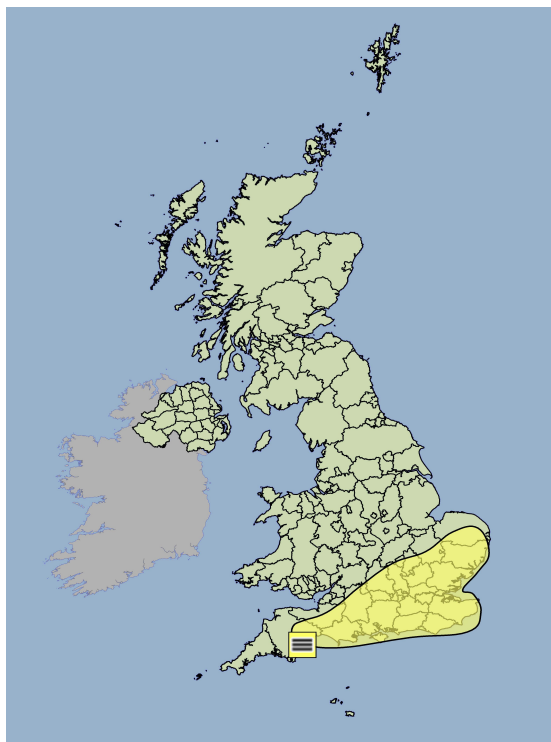




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Patchy fog is expected to become more widespread over the next few hours. Not everywhere in the yellow area will see fog, but where it does form it may be dense, leading to difficult driving conditions. The fog should gradually lift into low cloud by mid morning, though may take a little longer to clear from some higher routes.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Fog**

Valid from **05:30 on Mon, 07th Oct 2013** until **10:00 on Mon, 07th Oct 2013**

Patchy fog is expected to affect parts of southern and southeastern England this morning. Visibility may locally fall below 100 metres. The public should be aware of the potential for some minor disruption to travel.
