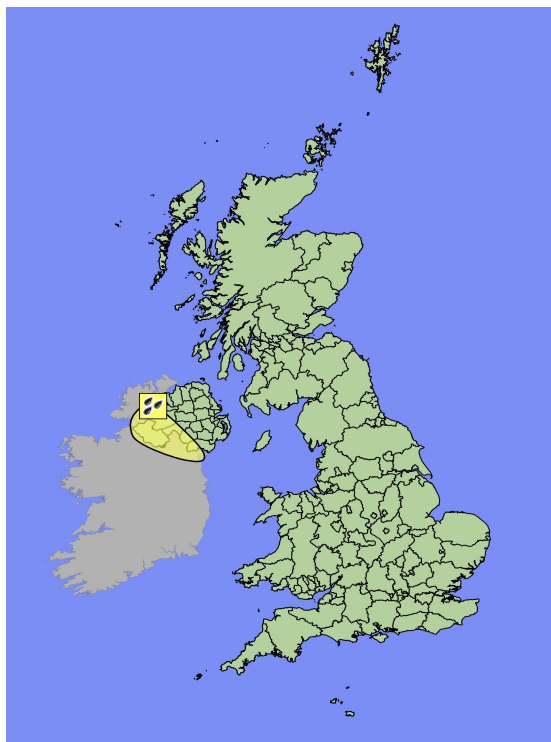




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A low pressure system passing slowly eastwards well to the south of N Ireland will again allow heavy showers to develop during the afternoon. These are likely to be heavy and slow moving in places. Rain rates up to 15 mm in the hour and totals of 20-40 mm in 3 hours are possible and may lead to surface water flooding issues. Showers are expected to die out during the evening.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **12:00 on Sat, 04th Aug 2012** until **20:00 on Sat, 04th Aug 2012**

Some very heavy showers with a risk of thunder expected to develop during the afternoon. These could be prolonged and slow moving in places before dying out during the evening.

The public should be aware of a risk of isolated surface water flooding and possible disruption to transport.
