



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A deep depression will track southeastwards close to the eastern side of the UK on Tuesday reaching the Low Countries early Wednesday. Brisk, cold northerly flow becomes established across the UK for Wednesday in the wake of this depression bringing frequent wintry showers across the North Sea and down the eastern side of the UK.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Snow**

Valid from **00:05 on Wed, 06th Feb 2013** until **23:59 on Wed, 06th Feb 2013**

Heavy, blustery wintry showers will affect parts of Scotland during Wednesday, northern and northeastern parts seeing the heaviest and most frequent showers. Accumulations of snow are likely to be quite variable, especially in coastal areas, though some areas of high ground are likely to see accumulations of snow in excess of 10 cm. Drifting of snow and temporary blizzard conditions may also affect higher level routes.

The public should be aware of the potential for disruption, especially to travel.
