Weather: It will be a dry day with clouds breaking to give some sunshine. Best of the sun will be over western mountains such as Knoydart, Skye and Torridon. Clouds more stubborn to break up further east.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Note stronger winds and lower temperatures over higher ridges and summits making it feel very cold.

Forecast for Friday 05 May 2023

Weather: Mainly dry morning with some sunshine. Clouds building in the afternoon with scattered showers breaking out.

Maximum wind: Strong southeast winds, average speeds of 30mph with gusts 45mph.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70% in morning reducing 40% in the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Good visibility becoming poor as showers come along. Patchy cloud cover above 700m becoming more extensive in the afternoon.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 3 Celsius rising to 15 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 4 Celsius rising to 7 Celsius.
Freezing level: 1200m at first, lifting above the summits by the afternoon.
