Forecast for Tuesday 09 Aug 2022

Weather: Cloudy overnight but perhaps a few clear spells for more eastern ranges around the Lecht. A weak band of rain will move east across the area around dawn with thickening cloud and some light and patchy rain for a time. This will clear away east by mid morning and during the afternoon any lingering low cloud will lift and clear with some sunny intervals likely by mid afternoon especially in the east. Cloud clearing most areas during the evening with some late sunshine.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: In the west 50% increasing to 90%, in the east 70% increasing to 100%. Low cloud in association with band of light rain moving east in the morning.

Low cloud and visibility: West of the A9, the ranges will see scattered cloud later above 600m from dawn, this will lift and clear during the afternoon. Further east towards the Northern Cairngorms and Speyside cloud will mostly be patchy around 700m in the morning and will soon clear leaving the summits cloud free in the afternoon. Visibility will be reduced below 5km in any light and patchy rain and drizzle in the morning but will improve and become very good in the afternoon and evening with far reaching views.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Quite a breezy day and winds likely to be stronger on the higher Cairngorm mountains. Feeling warmer around eastern ranges of Moray.

Forecast for Wednesday 10 Aug 2022

Weather: A dry, bright and sunny day expected and feeling warm at low level especially further east towards Speyside and the Lecht.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly 20 gust 30 mph.
