Confidence: High for transition to colder showery north to northwest flow Monday, also for this declining early Wednesday, but lowering for timings of the return of unsettled, relatively milder, westerly flow thereafter.

Headline for Monday 03 Jan 2022: Snow and rain clearing to sunshine and isolated snow showers later Monday morning, these building a little during the evening. Turning bitterly cold at height.

Forecast for Monday 03 Jan 2022

Weather: Cloudy overnight and at first Monday with periods of snow and rain. Snow level 900m lowering 300m mid-morning before dry and clear conditions spread from the north mid to late morning. Thereafter a mix of bright and sunny spells and a few well scattered snow showers for the rest of the day, with outbreaks building a little from the north during the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 20% becoming 95% plus by noon.

Visibility: Generally good or very good, becoming in early periods of snow and rain, also in subsequent showers moderate to very poor, also only a few metres in hill fog, with bases widespread initially and sporadically in later showers from 450-600m.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Hill fog quite extensive early Monday. Severe chill turning increasingly marked.

Forecast for Tuesday 04 Jan 2022

Weather: Brighter spells and some scattered snow showers, these always focused across northern ranges such as Monadhliath.

Maximum wind: North or northwest mean 35-40mph with gusts reaching 55-60mph across more exposed ridges and summits

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: By day for any given time 75% in north, 95% in south, but limited scope for prolonged clear spells given showery nature of airstream.

Visibility: Generally good or very good, briefly becoming in snow showers poor or very poor, also only a few metres in hill fog, with bases lowering 300-450m in showers.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 4 Celsius rising plus 4 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Minus 4 Celsius
Freezing level: 100-200m
