Forecast for Wednesday 04 May 2022

Weather: A cloudy morning with outbreaks of rain, but some drier interludes too. Becoming dry from early afternoon with some spells of sunshine developing. Dry in the evening.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30% in the morning, becoming 70% in the afternoon

Low cloud and visibility: Poor in morning mist and low cloud, extensive low cloud down to 500 metres. However ranges east of the A9 may see only small amounts of low cloud in the morning. A marked improvement expected in the afternoon as clearer weather spreads from the west although some patchy cloud above 700 metres expected around Ben Alder and towards Rannoch Moor.

Forecast for Thursday 05 May 2022

Weather: A cloudy day with some occasional rain, this mainly first thing in the morning. Some good spells of dry weather developing across the Cairngorms through the day, but the far west may see some drizzly rain at times. Cold wind at height.

Maximum wind: Southwesterly gust 30 to 40 mph on the higher summits

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 50%

Low cloud and visibility: Ranges across the west of the area will see extensive cloud down to 500 to 800 metres for most of the day. Ranges east of the A9 including the more eastern Cairngorms seeing the best of the cloud free summits, with only small amounts of cloud on the tops.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 6 rising to 13 Celsius
At 800m: Plus 6 Celsius
Freezing level: Above summits
