Headline for Tuesday 08 Feb 2022: Sunny spells. Wintry showers, mainly confined to the west. Very cold in severe gales.

Forecast for Tuesday 08 Feb 2022

Weather: A day of sunshine and scattered, sleet and snow showers, these of rain at lower levels. Showers mainly confined to western peaks such as Monadhliath and Ben Alder, with the best of the shelter across eastern peaks such as The Lecht.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90% for any given time, significantly less for brief periods due to the showery nature of the airstream.

Low cloud and visibility: Good or very good becoming poor or very poor in showers, only a few meters in hill fog which infrequently lowers 600m as showers push through.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Widespread severe wind-chill, particularly at height.

Forecast for Wednesday 09 Feb 2022

Weather: Snow showers with outbreaks more frequent than Tuesday, again always more focused across western peaks.

Maximum wind: Westerly initially mean 35-40mph with gusts reaching 55mph across most exposed ridges and summits, easing a little from mid-afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 80% for any given time, significantly less for extended periods due to the showery nature of the airstream.

Low cloud and visibility: Good or very good becoming poor or very poor in showers, only a few meters in hill fog which sporadically lowers 450m as showers push through.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 2 Celsius increasing plus 5 Celsius during the afternoon
At 800m: Minus 5 Celsius
Freezing level: 300-400m
