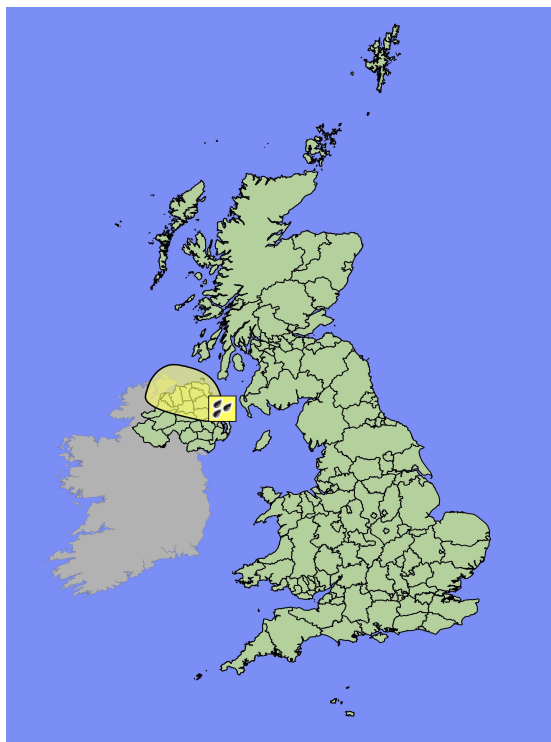




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

The remnants of the thunderstorms that affected parts of Cumbria and southwest Scotland on Thursday evening are drifting westwards and may affect Northern Ireland during the early hours of Friday. Where they do occur, some 15 to 20 mm mm of rain could occur in 2 or 3 hours. The showers are likely to ease towards dawn.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Fri, 06th Jul 2012** until **06:00 on Fri, 06th Jul 2012**

Heavy and possibly thundery showers are likely to affect northern parts of Northern Ireland during the early hours of Friday. The public should be aware that with the ground being saturated, the showers may lead to some surface water flooding.
