Forecast for Friday 07 May 2021

Weather: Northerly winds will bring further showers of sleet, hail and snow to all ranges through morning and much of the afternoon. A change in wind direction will leave the West Coast ranges increasingly dry and clear through later afternoon and all ranges likely dry by late evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 30% increasing 70% through afternoon.

Visibility: Areas of cloud will be persistent above 400-600m through morning, perhaps briefly lower during passing showers. Breaks will become more widespread during afternoon as cloud lifts and showers fade away. Snow will reduce visibility to a few hundred metres at times.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Best conditions expected later in the day. Ice and fresh snow will make for slippery conditions, especially early and late.

Forecast for Saturday 08 May 2021

Weather: A day of contrasting conditions as a cold, frosty and largely dry morning gives way to strengthening easterly winds, thick cloud and periods of rain and snow. This rain will arrive across Skye and the Great Glen from late morning, falling as snow above 400m initially, spreading to all ranges by mid afternoon. The snow level will gradually rise with rain across all but highest levels after dark. West Coast seeing the most shelter and while persistent rain and snow affects Easter Ross and Strathconon.

Maximum wind: Easterly 15-20mph increasing 25-35 gusting up to 50mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90% falling to 10%.

Visibility: Very little low level cloud through morning but cloud will become persistent above 300-500m in the east, 600-800m in the west.

Temperature: **Glens:** 0-3C rising to 7-9C.
At 800m: Minus 1 or 2 C.
Freezing level: 400m rising 1000m.
