Forecast for Tuesday 01 Mar 2022

Weather: Isolated snow showers in the west at first, falling as snow above 500-700 m. Otherwise dry with sunnt spells through the day, though isolated hill fog on the higher summits in the west at first. Remaining cold and dry through the evening with some clear spells and a frost.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 70% at first, increasing 90% by midday.

Low cloud and visibility: Good visibility away from isolated snow showers and hill fog, where visibility will decrease to moderate or poor. Patchy cloud 500-800 m early morning but soon dispersing.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

A bright day in the hills with eye protection advised on the high tops and plateau to protect against snow glare. Severe wind chill, with warm clothing essential.

Forecast for Wednesday 02 Mar 2022

Weather: A dry start to the day with some pleasant sunny spells, but thickening cloud through afternoon, with outbreaks of rain or summit snow, particularly in the south. Winds quickly strengthening, with gales or severe gales on the summits from late morning.

Maximum wind: Southeasterly 35-45 mph, gusting 45-55 mph from late morning, perhaps 60 mph on the Cairngorm Plateau.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90% through the morning, decreasing to 30% through the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Good visibility through the morning, decreasing moderate in rain later through the afternoon. Patchy cloud bases 900-1100 m through the morning, lowering 300-600 m later in the afternoon.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 1 celsius rising to plus 4 celsius.

At 800m: Minus 3 celsius, rising to zero.

Freezing level: All elevations overnight, rising 400 m through morning, and near summits afternoon.
