Forecast for Wednesday 08 Sep 2021

Weather: A fine dry, warm to hot day with plentiful bright and sunny spells, which soon burn away any early mist and fog patches in and around the foothills. However rather hazy, and across far western and northern ranges such as the Cuillin Ridge and towards Suilven some patchy cloud which may bring the odd shower from mid-afternoon.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 95% plus with cloud even in any showers likely to be above summits.

Visibility: Generally good occasionally moderate in haziness, moderate in any showers.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Forecast for Thursday 09 Sep 2021

Weather: Some early patchy fog and low cloud in and around the foothills. Most staying dry through the morning with good bright and sunny spells. Gradually turning cloudier from the south through the afternoon and evening, with showers building, perhaps bringing thunder and hail from late afternoon.

Maximum wind: Generally East to southeast 15mph or less.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 90% becoming 70% later.

Visibility: Good or very good, becoming moderate or poor in showers, very poor in hill fog, with bases sporadically lowering 600m in showers, mainly from late afternoon.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 10 Celsius increasing 22 Celsius during the afternoon

At 800m: Plus 13-15 Celsius

Freezing level: Well above summits
