


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Things are improving as pressure starts to rise across the UK, though we retain a residue of the convective instability of recent days. So further showers are expected, some heavy, with the potential still for 20 mm or so in the hour.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **10:00 on Tue, 07th Aug 2012** until **22:00 on Tue, 07th Aug 2012**

Showers will not be widespread or as heavy as of late, though isolated thundery downpours are still likely today. The public are advised to remain aware of the risk of localised flooding.
