Forecast for Tuesday 05 Jul 2022

Weather: Tuesday will start cloudy, with associated hill fog and patchy light rain or drizzle. It will remain rather cloudy during the morning but the cloud will gradually break up to give some afternoon sunshine.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 30% with low cloud covering hills above 400m. Improving to 70% by late morning with patchy low cloud down to 500m above sea level. 90% through the afternoon but lowering to 30% during the late evening.

Low cloud and visibility: Hill fog and poor visibility likely on hills over 400m at first. Improving to good during the morning with excellent views of distant hills during the afternoon. Lowering again late evening.

Meteorologist's View

Afternoon UV levels will be high in the strong July sunshine, so sun protection is recommended. Also, pollen levels will be very high, with it being peak grass pollen season. Hay fever sufferers are recommended to take precautions

Forecast for Wednesday 06 Jul 2022

Weather: Rather like Tuesday, the early hours of Wednesday will be cloudy, with associated hill fog and drizzle. It will remain rather cloudy during the morning but the cloud will gradually break up to give some afternoon sunshine.

Maximum wind: North-westerly 15 mph with gusts of 25 mph on the summits in the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops 600m: 30% overnight and at first with low cloud covering hills 300m above sea level. Improving to 70% with patchy low cloud down to 500m during the morning and 90% in the afternoon. Deteriorating again after dusk.

Low cloud and visibility: Poor overnight with fog above 400 metres. Improving quickly during the morning with distant hills visible by lunchtime. Deteriorating again after dusk.

Temperature: **Valleys:** 10c at dawn, rising to 19C in the afternoon.
At 600m: 7C at dawn, rising to 13 C in the afternoon.
Freezing level: Well above summits.
