Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 18 hours.

General Situation: Low clearing eastern English Channel. Low Northeast Scotland will continue to move slowly southeast. Ridge building in west.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.
Wind: north 7 to severe gale 9, decreasing 4 or 5.
rain or squally showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

Shetland.
Wind: north 7 to severe gale 9, decreasing 4 or 5 later.
rain or squally showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.
Wind: southwesterly veering northwesterly, 6 to gale 8, occasionally severe gale 9 in north.
rain or squally showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From Whitby to North Foreland.
Wind: westerly veering northwesterly 5 to 7, occasionally gale 8.
rain or squally showers.
Visibility: moderate or good.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.
Wind: northwest 5 to 7, occasionally gale 8 at first.
squally showers.
Visibility: good.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.
Wind: northwest 6 to gale 8, decreasing 4 or 5.
squally showers.
Visibility: good.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.
Wind: northwesterly 6 to gale 8, occasionally severe gale 9 in north at first, decreasing 4 or 5.
squally showers.
Visibility: good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.
Wind: northwest 6 to gale 8, occasionally severe gale 9 at first, decreasing 4 or 5.
showers.
Visibility: good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.
Wind: northwest 6 to gale 8, occasionally severe gale 9 at first, decreasing 4 or 5.
showers.
Visibility: good.
