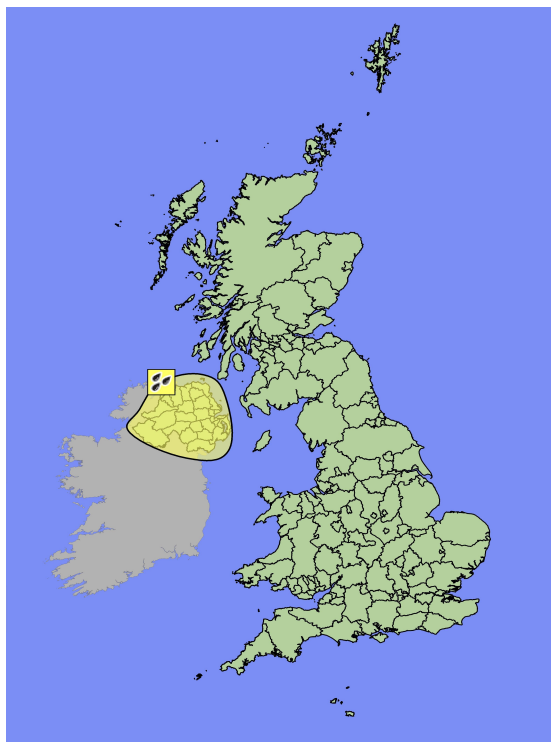




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active front will push in from the Atlantic and slow down over Northern Ireland as a low pressure centre forms along it. Accumulations of more than 15 mm are expected widely, with more than 30 mm locally.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **06:00 on Sun, 10th Feb 2013** until **21:00 on Sun, 10th Feb 2013**

Rain will be persistent and heavy at times during Sunday with heaviest rain in the west. The rain may turn to snow, mostly on higher ground in the east, before dying out later in the day, though there is also the risk of some snow to lower levels over central and eastern parts.

The public should be aware of possible travel disruption.
