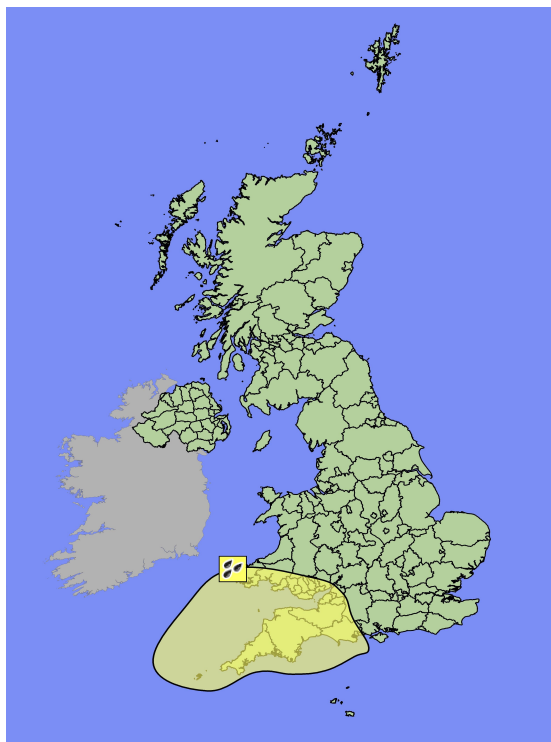




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

An active frontal zone will move east across southern Britain on Thursday, although there are uncertainties in the timing as well as the northward and eastwards extent of the associated rain. Amounts of rainfall are likely to be between 10 and 20 mm for most and isolated 30 mm locally - not normally much of an issue, but given the wet ground localised flooding is possible

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Rain**

Valid from **08:00 on Thu, 12th Jul 2012** until **23:59 on Thu, 12th Jul 2012**

Outbreaks of heavy rainfall are expected to cross southwestern areas of England and south Wales during Thursday.

The public should be aware that given ongoing near-saturated conditions, localised flooding may result.
