Forecast for Tuesday 06 Sep 2022

Weather: Some early mist and fog in the valleys will clear quickly leaving a generally dry but cloudy start to the day, with some sunny spells at times. Showers will develop from late morning, becoming heavy with a risk of thunder by late afternoon. Showers clearing to the north by midnight.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 60% increasing to 90% by midday. Dropping to 60% in any heavy showers.

Low cloud and visibility: Locally very poor visibility in any early mist and fog. This will lift and clear through the morning, however it may cover some slopes and summits for a time, with bases 400-600m. Any cloud will continue to lift to be above the summits by midday, though may drop to around 600-700m in any heavy showers or thunderstorms. Otherwise generally good visibility expected, although becoming poor in any showers.

Meteorologist's View

UV levels will be moderate in any prolonged sunshine, so some additional sun protection may be required. Conditions may change rapidly as heavy showers and thunderstorms develop through the afternoon, making navigation challenging as well as localised surface flooding affecting some routes. Suitable wet-weather gear may also be necessary.

Forecast for Wednesday 07 Sep 2022

Weather: A largely dry start to Wednesday morning with some long clear spells. Becoming cloudier from the south and west with outbreaks of heavy showery rain sweeping in through the morning. The rain, locally heavy and thundery in places, will gradually clear the park by late afternoon. Remaining cloudy into the evening with further showers possible.

Maximum wind: Southerly, 20-30mph with gusts up to 35mph.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 600m: 60% increasing to 80% by midday. Dropping to 60% in any heavy showers.

Low cloud and visibility: Early low cloud will lift to be above the summits by midday, however it may cover some slopes and summits during the morning, with bases 400-600m. Cloud bases may drop to around 600-700m in any heavy showers or thunderstorms. Otherwise generally good visibility expected, although becoming poor in any showers.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 14 Celsius, increasing to plus 22 Celsius.
At 600m: Plus 10 Celsius, increasing to plus 14 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above all summits.
