



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Following rain on Monday, an active cold front will bring heavier and more persistent rain during Tuesday. The focus of the heaviest rain is likely to be further north than previous expectations, with 20-40 mm likely across much of Argyll and Lochaber, with peak totals of 50 mm in more mountainous areas.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **09:00 on Tue, 13th Nov 2012** until **23:59 on Tue, 13th Nov 2012**

Outbreaks of rain will become persistent and heavy at times on Tuesday. Falling on already saturated ground, the public should be aware that this rain could lead to some localised disruption and the possibility of flooding.
