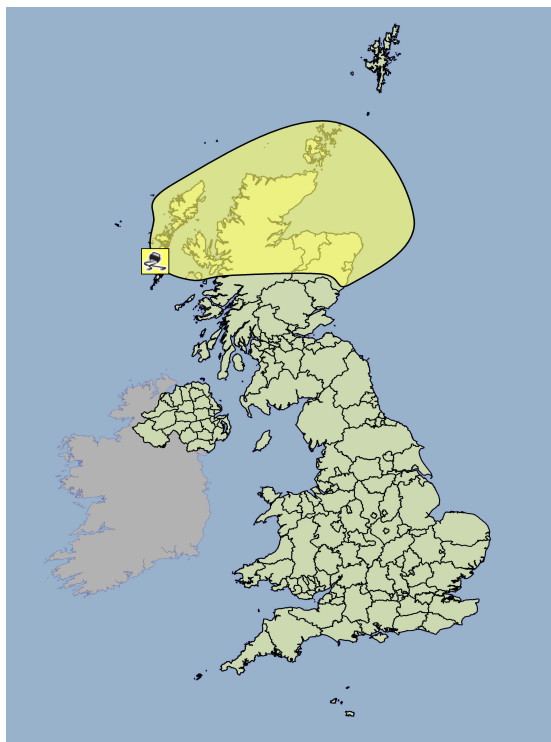




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Showers will continue to move inland across northern parts of Scotland for much of the night, leading to local salt wash off and thus an increased risk of ice where road surface temperatures are below freezing.

The showers will fall as snow over high ground with some slight accumulations of snow above approximately 400 metres.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **22:00 on Sat, 09th Nov 2013** until **10:30 on Sun, 10th Nov 2013**

Showers will affect northern Scotland on Saturday night leading to a risk of icy stretches on untreated surfaces. Snow may also be an additional hazard on some higher stretches of road, chiefly through the northwest Highlands.

The public are advised to take extra care.
