Forecast for Wednesday 03 Nov 2021

Weather: A distinctly wintry feel to the hills on Wednesday as cold northerly winds drive showers southwards across all ranges, although there will be some good shelter across Easter Ross and towards the Great Glen. The snow line will be around 700m, so there is a good chance of getting wet on ascent and descent, exacerbating the cold feel. Fleeting bright or sunny spells inbetween these showers. Showers becoming fewer into the evening with some clear spells.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 30%.

Visibility: Very variable as showers pass through with visibility in the hundreds of metres range in snow and a few kilometers on lower slopes during rain. Cloud cover will be often descend to around 500-600m, lifting between showers.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Be prepared for winter-like conditions. Mean wind speeds at 300m more likely to be 15-20mph.

Forecast for Thursday 04 Nov 2021

Weather: Lingering wintry showers will fade through the early hours leaving clearer spells and lighter winds and then a cold, bright and frosty start. Northerly winds will become westerlies, bringing thicker cloud and less cold conditions through afternoon and eventually patchy rain (or sleet above munro level) by evening.

Maximum wind: North 20-25mph gusting 35mph, gradually backing westerly through the day.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80% falling 20% from mid afternoon.

Visibility: No issues through morning with very little low level cloud, perhaps the odd mist or fog patch in the glens. Cloud will thicken and lower through afternoon, eventually becoming extensive above 400-600m by evening, perhaps lower along the west coast. Drizzly conditions will turn lower slopes increasingly hazy.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 2 or 3 Celsius, but locally freezing in some sheltered glens, rising to 5 Celsius by midday and then 8 Celsius through evening.

At 800m: Minus 2 Celsius rising plus 2 Celsius through late afternoon.

Freezing level: 600-800m through the bulk of the day, rising above summits from late afternoon.
