Forecast Issued on Monday 01 Nov 2021 at 02:36

Confidence: Continuing unsettled on Monday with showery, windy conditions, lower confidence for the amount of showers and amount of rainfall. High confidence for a change to colder more settled conditions from Tuesday.

Headline for Monday 01 Nov 2021: Heavy showers developing at times, feeling very cold as the strong southwesterly winds veer westerly and increase, gales possible on the fell tops.

Forecast for Monday 01 Nov 2021

Weather: Showery outbreaks of rain will continue for much of the day, showers will be heavy at times and may group together at times however they should move through quite quickly in strong winds. A few brighter spells in possible at times too, particularly later in the afternoon. Showers may turn wintery at the top of Scafell Pike during the afternoon.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 40%, low cloud in association with showery outbreaks, more cloud breaks likely for south and eastern fells. Improving to 70% in the afternoon when a lot of low cloud will disperse.

Visibility: Out with shower visibility below the cloud will be good however it will be quite poor at times in showers. Cloud bases will be up and down but scattered or broken cloud above 600m is likely for the morning, lower and thicker cloud is expected in the west. Cloud tending to thin and lift in the afternoon with just patches around 700m.

Meteorologist's View

Southwesterly winds will veer northwesterly later in the day which will help low cloud to clear, however it will also be a colder airstream so wind-chill will increase in the afternoon. Gales are likely on the fell tops in the middle of the day.

Forecast for Tuesday 02 Nov 2021

Weather: A few showers overnight will continue during the day but a lot of bright and sunny weather too, a few heavier showers expected.

Maximum wind: Westerly or northwesterly 10-15mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 80%, scattered low cloud around the fell tops in showers.

Visibility: General visibility will be good or very good but it will be poor at times in heavier showers.

Temperature: **Valleys:** Plus 9 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 1 rising to 5 Celsius.
Freezing level: 1200m
