Forecast for Friday 09 Sep 2022

Weather: Mostly cloudy morning with patchy rain at first, mainly in east of area, gradually dying out. Dry, brighter weather developing over Monadhliath mountains and Creag Meagaidh in the morning, extending to all ranges during the afternoon.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 30% improving 80% in the afternoon.

Low cloud and visibility: Extensive mist with fog above about 600 to 700m, especially east of area during the morning. Good visibility developing in west of area with clouds lifting and breaking up. These improved conditions extending eastwards to all parts during afternoon.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Difficult walking conditions in the morning, especially in east with misty, damp weather and strong, gusty winds on the tops. Steady improvement moving in from west during the day.

Forecast for Saturday 10 Sep 2022

Weather: A much improved day across the North Grampian area. Most ranges will be dry, bright with sunny spells. Some early mist and fog in the glens at first.

Maximum wind: Light winds at all levels.

Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m: 90%

Low cloud and visibility: Mist in some glens at first, gradually dispersing, otherwise very good visibility with patches of cloud about 800m.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 4 Celsius rising to 18 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 10 Celsius.
Freezing level: Well above the summits.
