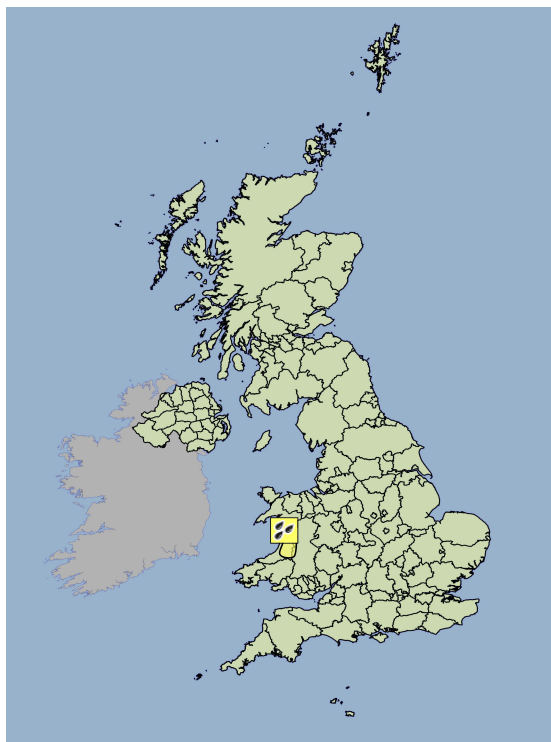




National Severe Weather Warning Service



CANCELLED

Chief Forecasters Assessment

A front will become slow-moving in a west to east direction across Wales on Saturday night and much of Sunday. Strong moist westerly flow running into the high ground will assist a progressive build-up of large rainfall totals through the period. The rain should ease later on Sunday.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Sun, 11th May 2014** until **15:00 on Sun, 11th May 2014**

Rain is likely to become persistent and, at times, heavy on Saturday night across parts of west Wales and last well into Sunday. Rainfall totals will steadily build up with some 30 to 60 mm falling by late Sunday and perhaps over 80 mm in a few spots in the mountains. The public should be aware of the risk of localised flooding.
