



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A slow-moving weather system affecting southeastern parts of Britain will give 20-40 mm of rain quite widely across the area, with perhaps as much as 60-80 mm in places through the whole day. In some places 20-30 mm could fall within 2 or 3 hours. At this stage there remains uncertainty in the exact location of the largest rainfall totals.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Wed, 09th Aug 2017** until **23:55 on Wed, 09th Aug 2017**

Periods of heavy rain are likely to persist for much of Wednesday. Some transport routes may be affected by localised flooding leading to longer journey times. In addition localised flooding of homes and businesses is possible.

The heaviest of the rain should gradually become confined to the extreme southeast of the UK later in the day.
