Forecast for Thursday 04 Feb 2021

Weather: Bright spells with a little sunshine and scattered snow showers. The showers will be mainly in east of area, especially around Ben Wyvis with just the odd light flurry in the west.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 60%, best in the west. Occasional cloud cover around 700m, more extensive in east of area.

Visibility: Generally good but briefly poor visibility as snow showers pass by.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Feeling bitterly cold due to combination of strong to gale force winds and temperatures well below freezing.

Forecast for Friday 05 Feb 2021

Weather: It will be a cloudy day with more frequent and heavier snow showers. The showers will become prolonged for a time with blizzard conditions likely. Also drifting and blowing of lying snow. Bitterly cold.

Maximum wind: Gale force east or northeasterly winds, average speeds 30 to 40mph and gusts 60mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Very little chance.

Visibility: Moderate or poor and virtually zero in heavier snow and blowing snow.

Temperature: **Glens:** Minus 2 Celsius rising briefly to plus 1 Celsius.

At 800m: Minus 3 Celsius.

Freezing level: All levels.
