



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A band of showers will move eastwards across Scotland on Friday evening with heavy bursts likely. This will fall primarily as a mixture of rain, sleet and hail but will also fall as snow above around 200m, particularly in any heavier outbreaks. Following this band, further showers will continue to push in, mainly for western parts, but with more in the way of cloud breaks. This will keep some surfaces wet and allow surface temperatures to fall below freezing in places with icy stretches forming.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **20:00 on Fri, 21st Mar 2014** until **09:00 on Sat, 22nd Mar 2014**

Icy patches are expected overnight, as roads will remain wet from showers Friday evening and overnight into Saturday. These showers will continue to fall as a mixture of rain, sleet and hail with snow mostly over higher ground. Higher routes, mainly across Argyll and the Highlands, could see snow accumulations of around 5cm.

The public should be aware of possible disruption due to icy surfaces on Friday night and during Saturday morning.
