Forecast for Saturday 06 Nov 2021

Weather: Rain, heavy and persistent during the morning, combined with strong winds to give drenching conditions. Rain clearing east early afternoon then bright or clear spells and showers, some heavy and possibly thundery. The showers turning to snow above 800m in the afternoon then 600m in the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: Less than 10% in morning becoming 60% in afternoon.

Visibility: Poor in the morning with extensive cloud and fog above 400 or 500m, perhaps higher in the northeast. Good between showers in the afternoon but poor at times in showers with occasional blizzard conditions on the tops later.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

A very unsettled day with severe gales or storm force winds making safe travel very difficult on the tops. These very strong winds developing at all levels later in the evening.

Forecast for Sunday 07 Nov 2021

Weather: Mainly cloudy with outbreaks of rain, falling as sleet or snow above 800m. Very windy at height with storm force winds making mobility almost impossible on the tops in the morning. Rain, summit snow and winds will ease through the late afternoon and evening. Clear spells and a grass frost overnight.

Maximum wind: West or Northwest 50 to 60mph with gusts 80mph in morning, easing to 20 to 30mph in the afternoon. Sudden unexpected downslope gusts on lee slopes.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 30%, perhaps 60% in far southwest.

Visibility: Often poor on the tops with frequent cloud above 600m and occasional sleet or snow. Perhaps longer breaks in the far southwest and more generally later.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 6C rising to 8 or 9C.
At 800m: Plus 1 or 2C.
Freezing level: 1000m in south, 1200m in north.
