



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An Atlantic low pressure system will push fronts across Scotland early Thursday, which will gradually clear to the northeast with a mild and moist west to southwest flow following. Precise rainfall totals are very uncertain at this stage but given recent significant rainfall events there is a risk of further localised flooding.

This warning will be updated over the coming days as more information becomes available and confidence increases in respect of rainfall totals.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Thu, 04th Feb 2016** until **23:55 on Thu, 04th Feb 2016**

A band of rain, heavy at times, will push across Scotland from the early hours of Thursday morning. This rain may be persistent over parts of the Western Highlands, Argyll and to a lesser extent the southwest of Scotland, with a risk of localised flooding.

Please be aware of the risk of some travel disruption.
