Forecast for Saturday 03 Jul 2021

Weather: Rather cloudy with a few showers in north of area, dying out overnight. Many ranges will be dry on Saturday morning with some sunshine. A few heavy afternoon showers breaking out with a small risk of thunder.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70%

Visibility: Generally good with occasional cloud cover about 700m. There will be brief deteriorations in visibility as showers come along, especially during the afternoon with cloud bases lowering a little.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Still a lot of dry weather on Saturday then a marked change to more unsettled weather.

Forecast for Sunday 04 Jul 2021

Weather: Sunday will start off mostly dry and bright with sunny spells. Clouds building with an increasing risk of showers breaking out from late morning. Some showers in the afternoon and early evening will be heavy and possibly thundery. It will be a warm humid day.

Maximum wind: Light southeasterly winds on the tops, average speeds of 10 to 15mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 70% in the morning decreasing 30% in afternoon.

Visibility: Generally good away from showers with cloud bases about 700 to 800m. Visibility will become poor as heavier showers come along and clouds coming well down the hills.

Temperature: **Glens:** 13 Celsius at dawn rising to 23 Celsius by early afternoon.

At 800m: Plus 12 Celsius.

Freezing level: Well above the tops.
