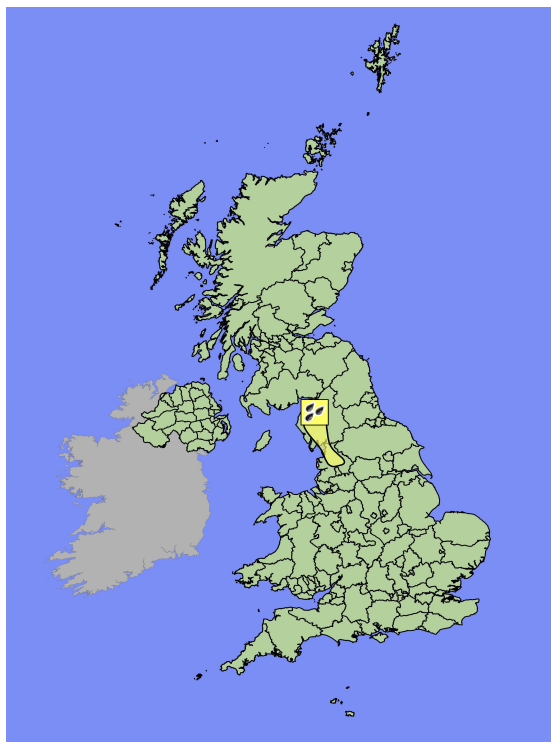




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

A mild but moist west to southwest flow looks likely to bring over 100 mm to parts of upland NW England, though in general amounts will be much smaller in low lying areas and any disruption is expected to be very localised.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **18:00 on Mon, 20th Feb 2012** until **23:59 on Wed, 22nd Feb 2012**

Persistent and occasionally rain will bring some high totals to the high ground of Lancashire and Cumbria. The public are advised to be aware of the risk some localised flooding.

The public should be aware that the cumulative effect of the rainfall may lead to some localised, minor flooding issues later on Tuesday and into Wednesday.
