### Forecast for Sunday 03 Apr 2022

**Weather:** Dry through the early hours with some clear spells or high based clouds, and a severe chill. A dry and bright start to the morning but cloud will start to thicken by midday, and rain or hill snow will quickly follow from the northwest. A wet afternoon with hill snow later falling as rain at all elevations, heavy and persistent at times, and widespread hill fog. Strong to gale westerly or southwesterly winds, strengthening to severe gales at elevation, perhaps storm force. These combining with hill snow to give blizzard conditions at times.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** Greater than 90% until midday. Lowering to near zero chance in the afternoon and evening.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Good visibility until midday with small amounts of low cloud with bases above the summits. Moderate or poor visibility in the afternoon and evening due to rain and hill snow, and falling very poor in blowing snow and hill fog with widespread cloud bases 350-550 m.

## Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

There will be a significant contrast in the weather from morning to afternoon, with a multitude of hazards developing.

## Forecast for Monday 04 Apr 2022

**Weather:** Heavy and persistent rain will continue until late-morning on Monday. For the rest of the day there will be showers or longer spells of rain, falling as snow above 800 m, and isolated hill fog. Gale or severe gale westerly or northwesterly winds, reaching storm force on the Cairn Gorm Plateau.

**Maximum wind:** Westerly or northwesterly mean 45-50 mph gusting 60-70 mph on exposed Cairn Gorm Plateau.

**Chance of cloud-free hill tops above 800m:** Near zero increasing 50% by midday.

**Low cloud and visibility:** Moderate or poor visibility in the morning due to rain and hill snow, and falling very poor in hill fog with widespread cloud bases 300-500 m. Cloud bases lifting to 600-800 m in the afternoon with isolated hill fog, and visibility improving to good away from showers.

**Temperature:** Glens: Plus 6 Celsius.

**At 800m:** Plus 4 Celsius falling to minus 1 Celsius.

**Freezing level:** Above summits, lowering 1000-1200 m in afternoon and 600-800 m in evening.
