


# National Severe Weather Warning Service



**Chief Forecasters Assessment**

An active frontal system containing very moist air has brought close to 100 mm of rain to parts of upland northwest England and 60 mm for upland parts of western Scotland, though in general amounts have been much smaller in low lying areas. Any disruption is expected to be very localised.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:00 on Wed, 22nd Feb 2012** until **21:00 on Wed, 22nd Feb 2012**

Rain is now easing, though river levels remain high and are expected to reach their peak this evening.

The public should be aware that there remains a risk of localised flooding.
