


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A front will become slow-moving over Southern and Central Scotland on Thursday afternoon and evening before clearing southeast in the early hours of Friday. There is currently some uncertainty over its position and timing but the yellow area depicts the most likely region for some minor disruption.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Thu, 06th Mar 2014** until **06:00 on Fri, 07th Mar 2014**

Outbreaks of rain will become heavier and more persistent during Thursday afternoon and evening, before clearing during the early hours of Friday morning. Accumulations of 20-30mm are expected quite widely, with 40-50mm over the hills, mainly over the Southern Uplands. The public should be aware of the risk of some minor travel disruption due to flooding on roads.
