



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Whilst the worst of the strong winds, associated with Storm Barabara, will have eased winds are expected to remain sufficiently strong through Christmas Eve (Saturday) morning to bring some further disruption to travel, such as delays to ferry services and bridge restrictions.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Wind**

Valid from **00:00 on Sat, 24th Dec 2016** until **12:00 on Sat, 24th Dec 2016**

The strong westerly winds are expected to continue during Saturday morning across northern Scotland before easing during the afternoon. Gusts of 55-65mph are expected widely, with occasional gusts of 75mph across more exposed parts. Further disruption to travel is possible.
