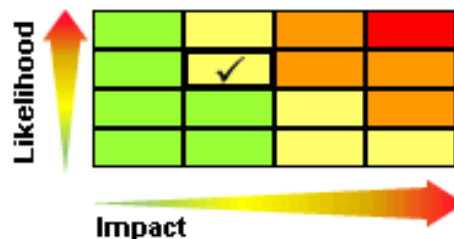

A band of sleet and snow will move southwards across parts of southwest England this afternoon. 2-5 cm is possible locally on ground above around 200 m but small accumulations are possible on grassy verges at lower levels. As colder air follows from the northeast, temperatures will fall below freezing bringing icy stretches on untreated surfaces.

Some roads are likely to be affected by longer journey times. There is also the possibility of some injuries from slips and falls on icy surfaces.
