



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Showers or rain is expected to develop through today, these becoming potentially heavy, prolonged and thundery by this afternoon. Locally torrential downpours are possible with 10 to 20 mm falling locally in an hour and as much as 30 to 40 mm in several hours. The thundery rain will clear from the west through the first half of the night.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **13:00 on Tue, 22nd Aug 2017** until **22:00 on Tue, 22nd Aug 2017**

Outbreaks of rain will become heavy across some parts of Northern Ireland this afternoon and evening. Northern and eastern areas will be most affected. Some short-lived heavy thundery downpours may cause isolated flooding and affect prone sections of road and disrupt travel. The rain will ease early tonight with county Antrim last to see the rain clear.
