Forecast Issued on Sunday 04 Jul 2021 at 16:42 by Met Office Aberdeen

Confidence: Low for Monday, large uncertainty in extent and intensity of the rain, particularly in the north.
Moderate for general developments through the rest of the period, but low for Tuesday night.

Headline for Monday 05 Jul 2021: Cloudy with outbreaks of rain. Often heavy with a risk of thunder in the afternoon.

Forecast for Monday 05 Jul 2021

Weather: Dry through the early hours and much of the morning north of Torridon, some sunny spells in the northwest, but low cloud for the Caithness hills. Further south, outbreaks of rain. The rain may become more widespread by the afternoon, although always likely to be heaviest to the south of Assynt, with a risk of thunder. Rain is likely to ease in intensity through the evening.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 40% in the east, 70% in the west.

Visibility: Generally moderate to poor for much of the day with cloud frequent above 600-800m in the east, but more occasional above 900m in the west. Cloud lowering to around 500-600m in the evening across Knoydart and perhaps the Cuillins.

Met Office Aberdeen Meteorologist's View

Moderate UV levels from late morning despite rather cloudy conditions. Note a risk of thunderstorms, especially in the afternoon.

Forecast for Tuesday 06 Jul 2021

Weather: Cloudy with showery outbreaks of rain. This likely to persist for much of the day with some heavier outbreaks, particularly in the afternoon.

Maximum wind: Light and variable becoming West or Southwest 10 mph.

Chance of cloud free mountain/hill tops above 800m: 10-20%, perhaps 60% in the afternoon and evening.

Visibility: Generally poor with cloud extensive above 500m early morning, rising to around 800-900m by late morning. Large uncertainty in cloud bases during the afternoon and evening, but a good chance of being above the summits.

Temperature: **Glens:** Plus 13 Celsius rising to 18 Celsius.
At 800m: Plus 8 Celsius rising to 10 Celsius.
Freezing level: Above the summits.
